The 2022 Summer Classic Horse Show is a sanctioned Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada, 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC.

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

EC supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under our jurisdiction.

Under the EC Statement of Principles, all persons shall be committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
 Ensuring that all equestrians, including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in
- Ensuring that all equestrians, including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care
 professionals to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard
 operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.

• Actively promoting the development of, and adherence to, competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The show is open to all, but the show committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- The Show Committee reserves the rights to add, amend, or delete any point not covered by the rules and to correct any error or make any necessary changes in the Prize List or Program. Any classes may be cancelled or combined at the discretion of the show committee. Entrants shall be notified.
- 3. Barn calls are a courtesy only. Exhibitors **must** check in with the Gate Attendant **before** the class is called into the ring. Those Exhibitors who have not checked in, may be stopped from entering the ring. Exhibitors must enter the ring promptly when called. The gate will close **two** minutes after the first horse enters the ring or in cases with large classes taking **more** than 2 minutes, after the entry of the final horse in a string of horses. Those not ready when called, will not be allowed to enter the ring once the gate is closed.
- 4. Gate holds will be granted at the discretion of Show Management and **must** be requested through the gate attendant well before the class, **preferably before the beginning of the session**, requiring the gate hold. Gate holds are restricted to **3 minutes** and tack changes/rider changes are to be done in the hitching ring area.
- 5. In the case where a horse shall lose a shoe, or for equipment breakage, seven (7) minutes will be allowed for replacement.
- 6. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected 18. The Judge's decision is final in all classes. No one will approach the Judge with regard to a decision unless he/s
- 7. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.
- All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
- 9. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
- 10. Upon any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the Officials by an owner, groom, rider or driver, the owner may forfeit their entry fee and as such will be reported to the Show Committee and/or EC. The Committee reserves the right to itself, the power to remove any groom, horse, rider, family member or persons associated with any horse or rider from the show grounds without being liable for compensation.
- 11. Protests shall be made in writing within forty-eight (48) hours of the holding of a class, to the show secretary and shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00 cash which sum shall be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.

- 12. Grooms are to appear in the ring neat, clean, and suitably attired.
- 13. No person other than officials, steward and attendants on duty may enter the ring without permission of the steward or show manager.
- 14. The abuse or inhumane treatment of a horse by an exhibitor, trainer or other person shall not be tolerated under any circumstances.
- 15. Hors Concours allowed. These entries must pay the same entry fee and are subject to the same conditions, which apply to regular entries as outlined in the division rules. Hors Concours entries are not eligible for any awards.
- 16. All entries must be made on the official entry form or a reasonable facsimile and be properly signed by the owner or authorized agent. Please include copies of registration papers and membership cards with entry form. All junior exhibitor entries must be signed by a parent or legal guardian.
- 17. Each horse shall be assigned a competition number, which must be visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. Any exhibitor using the wrong number or having no number in the ring may be excused from the class or may be disqualified in the event of a protest. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure they are wearing the correct number.
- 18. The Judge's decision is final in all classes. No one will approach the Judge with regard to a decision unless he/she first has permission from the Show Committee or Steward who shall arrange an appointment with the Judge at a proper time and place. No person may enter the space set aside for the Judge or hold communication with the Judge without permission.

19. SAFETY REGULATION: EC Article A905

(1) At all times, persons mounted or carriage driving at an EC Sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear as described below.

Exceptions: See discipline or breed sport rules:

(2) Protective Headgear must be:

a) Approved by an accredited certification organization. See glossary – Headgear Standards;

b) Properly fitted; and

c) Securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.

(3) Any competitor may wear approved protective headgear in any division or class without penalty from the Judge.
(4) EC makes no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any approved protective headgear. EC cautions riders and drivers that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear, as all equestrian sports involve inherent risk, and no protective headgear can protect against all foreseeable injury.

- 20. Dogs and other Pets: All dogs must be on a leash. Owners of dogs and other pets are responsible for their behavior. Owners bear sole responsibility and liability for incidents resulting from the presence and behavior of their animals. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets.
- 21. Participants must adhere to all Parking Regulations.
- 22. You are urged to take precautions in the stabling area and on the show grounds with personal items.
- 23. The Westerner reserves the right to take all precautions and reasonable steps necessary to ensure the safety of the public, exhibitors, and animals.

ACCIDENTS & RETURN TO PLAY

1. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location.

2. In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, (not limited to a direct blow to the head or loss of consciousness), the competitor must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite, through the EC Accident Injury Report Form before continuing. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. If the competitor refuses to be evaluated, he/she is disqualified from the event.

3. If the qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion (regardless of symptoms displayed), or believes that the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor is suspended from competition until medically released, as outlined in paragraph 6 below.

4. In the case of the preceding paragraphs, an EC Accident/Injury Report Form must be completed by either the attending Steward, Technical Delegate, or the attending qualified medical personnel onsite and submitted to EC within 24 hours of the occurrence. It is the Steward's / Technical Delegate's responsibility to ensure forms are complete and submitted on time.

5. Any competitor suspended from competing further at the event on the basis of any of the preceding paragraphs will be placed on a medical suspension list, managed by EC, until medically released as in the process described in paragraph

6. In the event a competitor is determined ineligible to compete per one of the above conditions, the competitor must submit the EC Return to Play Form to EC, completed by a licensed physician. The EC Return to Play Form will be processed by EC within two business days, at which point the competitor will be removed from the EC Medical Suspension list and may return to regular competition. If the competitor wishes to compete after being medically released by a physician but before the EC processing period of the form, the competitor must also submit a copy of the EC Return to Play Form to the show secretary. In this case the competitor is competing at their own risk and may be pursuant to fines and penalties if the form is found to be incomplete in any way.

7. No competitor shall compete in an EC sanctioned event while on the EC Medical Suspension List. It is the responsibility of the competitor to refrain from competition and the competition organizer may refuse entry to anyone currently on the EC Medical Suspension List.

Qualified Medical Personnel is defined as any of the following availability on the grounds may include any of the following: a) Doctor; b) Professional emergency personnel; such as EMT or Paramedic c) An adult with recognized and valid First Aid training who is not competing; this individual may act in some other capacity at the competition providing this does not restrict their availability to all areas on the competition grounds. It is strongly recommended that the minimum certification held by qualified medical personnel is First Responder Training.

EMERGENCY VETRNARY TREATMENT - A1005

The purpose of this article on emergency therapeutic veterinary treatment is to allow the Person(s) responsible to self-disclose to Equestrian Canada, in advance of competing, that a horse, because of acute illness or injury, required immediate treatment with a prohibited drug which may not have cleared in time for competition. Continuing the horse in competition must not be detrimental to the overall welfare of the horse nor accelerate the disease process and horses must not compete for 24 hours following treatment. To prevent abuse of emergency therapeutic treatment, equine medication control may be specifically targeted at horses mentioned in any Emergency Medication Report. By exception to the time listed in Article A1005.1, and EC General Regulations, Section A, Chapter 10 Article 1005.3, a horse that has been treated with 10mg of dexamethasone by a licensed veterinarian for an acute allergic reaction such as hives/urticaria must be withdrawn from competition for a minimum of 12 hours following administration. Permitted ONCE per competition.

The filing of an Emergency Medication Report is not an automatic defense to any subsequent certificate of positive analysis and/or an allegation by the Equestrian Canada Equine Medication Control Committee or its designate that there has been a violation of the equine medication rules. If the equine medication control result from an official sample collected from a horse treated as indicated on the Emergency Medication Report shows the presence of a drug, the Equestrian Canada Equine Medication Control Committee or its designate will fully investigate the matter and will review the nature of the alleged acute illness or injury, any relevant earlier filed Emergency Medication Reports, the therapeutic treatment administered, and the drug detected in the official sample.

In its sole discretion the Equestrian Canada Medication Control Committee may decide to take no further action, issue a warning or hold a hearing to determine if an Equine Medication Rule was violated. If a hearing is conducted, the information contained in the Emergency Medication Report and the veterinarian's medical records together with any other relevant information will be considered to determine whether there has been a violation of the equine medication rules.



MEMBERSHIPS

- 1. All owners, drivers, riders, lessees, agents or trainers must hold an EC Silver Sport License. There are exceptions for competitors from other countries, Lead Line competitors, headers/grooms and handlers in breeding line classes. (see EC General Rules; Section A; Chapter 2).
- 2. Assisted Walk-Trot & Assisted showmanship competitors will also be exempt from membership requirements.
- 3. All individual Sport License holders must also hold a current membership with the Alberta Equestrian Federation or the Provincial Sport organization of their province of residence.
- 4. Effective January 1, 2014 exhibitors who show in Morgan Classes at EC sanctioned shows must hold a current CMHA membership. All owners of Canadian owned Morgans who show in Morgan Classes at EC sanctioned shows must hold a current CMHA membership.
- 5. All owners and trainers of Canadian owned Saddlebreds must be current members of the ASHA of Canada.
- 6. All exhibitors showing in amateur classes must hold a current EC amateur card, and a copy must be included with entries.

ENTRIES

- 1. ENTRIES CLOSE AUGUST 5, 2022. Entries received later shall be considered post entries and will not appear in the show program.
- 2. Post entries will be accepted. NO ADDITIONAL CHARGE FOR HORSES ALREADY ENTERED. **\$50.00** LATE FEE FOR HORSES NOT ENTERED, PLUS CLASS FEES.
- 3. An office fee of \$25.00 per horse will be charged.
- 4. Every horse shall be assigned a number. This number must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.
- 5. Exhibitors canceling their entries after the official closing date shall forfeit their entry fees, except on certificate of disability from a qualified veterinarian, in which case all class fees will be refunded. Administration fees are non-refundable.
- 6. Copies of registration papers and memberships must be included with entry forms.
- 7. Entry form must be signed by all necessary parties. Junior exhibitor entries must be signed by a parent or legal guardian.
- 8. No entry is eligible to compete until the entry form has been signed by the person(s) responsible.
- (please see Glossary for definition of "Person(s) responsible")
- 9. All entries must be made in writing and must be accompanied by funds to cover all expenses involved, including entry and stabling fees and any other applicable charges. However, a competition has the option to state in their prize list that they will accept entries by fax or through online entry systems. Any competitor or agent who provides payment which is ultimately non-negotiable is in violation of these rules. (Article A801.4)

PARKING

- Horse trailers, vehicles and campers are to be parked in designated areas, as per signage/direction from show staff.
- FIRE LANES MUST BE KEPT CLEAR AT ALL TIMES

NOTE: Any changes to barn assignments must be made through the assigned Barn Manager. Failure to comply may result in expulsion from the grounds.

- Shavings will be provided.
- Stabling will be available at <u>10:00 a.m.</u>; Arena will be available 6:00 p.m. 11:00 p.m. Thursday, August 11, 2022.
- Absolutely <u>NO EARLY ARRIVALS</u> will be permitted.
- Horses are not restricted from leaving the show grounds during show.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. Classes offered herein are governed by the Rules and specifications of the current rules of the EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book
- 2. EXHIBITORS, JUDGES, & SHOW OFFICIALS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING APPROPRIATE EC & BREED ASSOCIATION RULES.
- 3. Novice horse is open to all horses that have not won three (3) first place ribbons at an EC or USEF show in the particular division in which they are shown.
- 4. Limit horse is open to all horses that have not won six (6) first place ribbons at an EC or USEF show in the particular division in which they are shown
- 5. Age of junior horses as per breed specifications.
- 6. To be "shown and judged" in a class, an animal must perform the prescribed routine and must remain in the ring until excused by the judge.
- 7. Eligibility for Championship classes; must have shown in qualifying class in that division.
- 8. An Amateur is an adult who is eligible to compete in EC amateur classes as per EC regulation. See Article A902.
- 9. Novice Rider must not have won 3, 1st place ribbons in the particular division in which they are showing.
- 10. Limit Rider must not have won 6, 1st place ribbons in the particular division in which they are showing.
- 11. Ladies Classes are restricted to lady riders, drivers, and handlers 18 & over as of Jan. 1.
- 12. There will be no age restriction for Walk-Trot/Jog Trail, however exhibitors may not cross enter into any class requiring a canter at this show.
- 13. Participants in Championship classes will NOT be required to strip horses for conformation

<u>Miscellaneous Class</u>. A class which meets the particular requirements of a competition and is beneficial to the area but does not conform to the specifications for any class or division included in these rules. Entries in these classes will not accumulate points towards EC awards. Such classes or divisions must be identified in the prize list as "not rated for EC awards".

Accademy Classes (Not Rated for EC Awards):

This is an introductory division, intended to encourage new exhibitors to participate in horse shows. Open to riders who have never shown in a regular performance class before. Training tack is permitted. Show clothes are not required, but riders shall wear neat & tidy clothing, appropriate for the discipline they are riding. Proper footwear & helmets are required. Riders may not cross enter into any other riding class at the same show. Horses are not restricted.

Assisted Showmanship (Not Rated for EC Awards):

Exhibitors may be accompanied in the ring by one suitably attired assistant, who is at least 16 years of age. Open to Exhibitors of any age who may require assistance. No cross entry with other Showmanship classes.

Assisted Walk-Trot (Not rated for EC Awards):

Any discipline. To be shown at a walk and trot, on a line, handled by one suitably attired assistant, who is at least 16 years of age. Open to Exhibitors of any age who may require assistance. No cross entry with other riding classes at the same competition. The horse is not restricted.

All Breed Jr/Sr Rider (Not Rated for EC Awards):

To be judged as a pleasure class, English or Western. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, trot/jog and canter. Sr. Rider to show the first direction, Jr. Rider to show the second direction.

Executive Pleasure (Not Rated for EC Awards):

Exhibitors must be 39+ years of age. Any discipline.

Green As Grass Pleasure (Not Rated for EC Awards):

Walk-trot classes to be judged on the rail at a walk and trot /jog only. Rider may use 2 hands on western bridle horses. Full appointments not required. All footwear must have a heel and be safe. Rider must never have been judged in any class requiring a canter. Judged on general horsemanship. Suitability of mount to rider to be considered.

Lead Line (Not Rated for EC Awards):

Any discipline. Rider may not enter any other riding class at the competition. The horse is not restricted. Leaders must be at least 14 years of age, and lead line must be attached to a cavesson, or a halter placed under the bridle. Rider must wear properly fitting, approved headgear and boots. Saddle must fit the rider, and rider's feet must be engaged in the stirrups. Safety of all competitors must be the primary consideration when conducting the class.

Ride-A-Fiver (Not Rated for EC Awards):

All Competitors must wear a **Proper protective Helmet** when participating in this class. Open to Exhibitors of any age. Must wear back number. Proper bridles are required and must be able to ride bareback on their horse. NO Shorts Allowed.

Schooling Classes (Not to be Judged):

May use training tack. Show clothes not required. Must wear back number. Announcer will make usual gait calls, but exhibitors may ride at will in a safe, respectful manner.

Walk-Trot 11 & Under (Not rated for EC Awards):

Open to riders 11 yrs and under. Walk and trot only. Rider may not cross enter into any other riding division at the same competition. The horse is not restricted.

DRESSAGE

All Dressage classes will be conducted in accordance with the current rules of Equine Canada – Section E.

ALL RIDERS MUST WEAR A HELMET WHEN COMPETING IN ANY DRESSAGE TEST.

Dressage Suitability:

Horses enter the ring at a walk in clockwise direction at the discretion of the ringmaster and officiating judge(s). Entries are to be shown in both directions in the ring at a walk, trot and canter. Horses will not be asked to gallop but may be asked to lengthen the stride at trot. 60% paces; 30% conformation; 10% General Impression (including impulsion, balance, rideability, presence and suitability to dressage).

Dressage Seat Equitation:

All the movements should be obtained with invisible aids and without apparent effort of the rider. The rider should be well balanced, elastic, sitting deep in the centre of the saddle and smoothly joining the rhythm of the horse with his loins and hips supple, thighs and legs steady and well stretched downwards. The heels should be the lowest point. The upper part of the body should be easy, free and erect on the vertical. The hands should be carried steady and low and close together, with the thumb as the highest point and independent from the seat. The elbows should be close to the body, enabling the rider to follow the movements of the horse smoothly and freely.

Class will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk, trot and canter, and on command, reverse and repeat. They shall then line up on command and execute individual tests at the judge's discretion. No individual performance may be requested that is not included in the class requirements. The judge may ask questions concerning horsemanship, anatomy of the horse, tack, stable management, etc.

WESTERN DRESSAGE (Not Rated for EC Awards)

Western dressage integrates the historically validated principles of dressage with the best of Western stock horse tradition. It is a systematic and progressive system of training for the Western horse and rider in traditional stock tack with the purpose of enjoying a safe, pleasurable, versatile, and useful working horse. The hallmarks of the Western dressage horse are usefulness, rideability, willingness, safety, pure gaits, lightness, calmness, and steadiness. A Western dressage rider should be attentive and tactful. They should use clear, effective, subtle aids coupled with a confident seat and light, responsive hands in communication with their horse. Western dressage classes are offered as miscellaneous classes at EC sanctioned competitions. The section has been incorporated into the USEF Rules and these classes will be conducted according to those rules.

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RANCH HORSE SECTION

The purpose of Ranch Pleasure should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse's performance should simulate a horse working outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward, working speed while under control of the rider. Light contact should be rewarded and the horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing the maneuver requirements and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations. Horses should NOT perform or be rewarded for performing gaits as they do in Western Pleasure. The horses are to be presented in a more forward-moving style than the typical Western Pleasure Horse. The horse and rider will be scored on movement, which is cadence and rhythm of gaits, smoothness and consistency in performance, along with how they perform the optional maneuvers.

The required gait maneuvers will include the walk, jog, and lope both directions; and the extended jog and extended lope going at least one direction; as well as stops, and a back. Optional maneuvers are side pass, turns of 360 degrees or more, change of lead (simple or flying), walk, jog or lope over a pole(s); or some combination of maneuvers that would be reasonable for a ranch horse to perform. The overall cadence and performance of the gaits should be free-flowing and ground covering at all gaits, with an emphasis on forward movement. Transitions should be performed where designated, with smoothness and responsiveness.

Ranch Riding: Each horse will work individually, performing both required and optional maneuvers, and scored on the basis of 0 to 100, with 70 denoting an average performance. Patterns are available at:

Ranch Pleasure: Horses will work as a group on the rail and will be asked to perform the required maneuvers only.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR DIVISION

Individuals are considered juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18 years. No modification is permitted.

Junior, Youth and young rider/driver competitors must be prepared to provide proof of age to competition management. All Junior entries must be signed by a parent or legal guardian

Stallions will NOT be permitted in Junior Exhibitor Classes.

OPEN PONY DRIVING

Ponies are animals that do not exceed 14.2 hands, unless otherwise specified in discipline/breed sport rules. To be shown to a suitable 2 or 4 wheel driving vehicle, both ways of the arena at a walk and trot. To stand quietly while lined up and may be asked to back.

MORGAN DIVISION

Horses shown in this division that are owned by a Canadian Resident for longer than 12 months must be purebred and registered with the Canadian Morgan Horse Association under the Canadian Livestock Records or if under one year of age, be eligible for registration, and must be entered under their full registered name.

Cross entering: in Classic Pleasure classes is allowed in all other English Pleasure and Pleasure Driving sections provided the toe and shoeing requirements of the horse are met. Cross entering in all other classes is permitted.

MORGAN JUNIOR Exhibitors

Riders in classes for Junior Competitors must not have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the previous year. The age of an individual on December 1st will be maintained throughout the following competition year. Riders/drivers in Young riders/drivers classes are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of sixteen until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. The age requirements set out in this rule defining adults and juniors shall supersede the definition for "junior(s)" and "adult(s)" set out in all Equestrian Canada rules, regulations, agreements and policies applicable to the Morgan Division. Junior age eligibility described under this Division is in accordance with the Morgan Horse Association. (See Glossary, "JUNIOR/YOUTH")

SADDLEBRED DIVISION

Horses must be of the American Saddlebred Horse Type.
